A reminder that these both take place this half term during May. KS1 assessments are carried out across the month and the week of KS2 testing starts Monday 14th May. Please remember attendance in school for the children in Year 2 and 6 is vital during this period.

SUN SAFETY

After the last newsletter reiterated snow procedures, it seems strange but necessary to remind you about sun safety. As the weather warms up, please remember to apply sunblock to your child before coming to school. We recommend using 8 hour sun protection so that



the children are covered for all outdoor activities. As a last resort, sun cream can be sent to school for the children to apply themselves, under adult supervision. Please make sure that all sun cream is clearly marked with your child's name.

Whenever possible, the children are taken onto the green areas to play during lunchtimes and so please ensure they bring a sunhat. They should also have a water bottle, clearly marked with their name and class – please note this should be a separate water bottle to the drink your child brings to have with their packed lunch from home. Thank you.

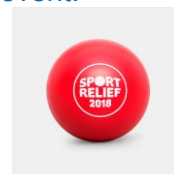

OUR VALUE OF THE MONTH – APRIL 2018 'RESPECT'

As you may know, each month in our worship we have a value that we explore with the children both in assembly and class time.

We start the term and the month of April focussing on the value of 'Respect'. This value is at the core of everything we do in school. It underpins learning through behaviour and attitude to the people and the world around all our children. We are extremely lucky that our school community (staff, children, parents, governors) is a very positive, supportive and respectful one.

As a school, one of the most important things we can teach the children is respect.

For our school, the best way to teach respect is to show respect. When a child experiences respect, they know what it feels like and begin to understand how important it is. We have been encouraging the children to keep in mind the saying "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Please support us in any way you can to reinforce this message – thank you.
