Contextual Safeguarding

The contextual safeguarding concerns at The Richard Wakefield CE Primary Academy have been highlighted currently as dangers linked to the local river and railway line, internet safety and in a wider context issues around county lines. The latter has impacted on pupils here due to issues with older siblings and family members. As a result of the heightened risk in these areas students have an intensive PHSE programme around these subjects and local PCSO's and other visitors deliver specific assemblies and sessions to appropriate years.

One of our teaching assistants is trained as a HOPE counsellor and she provides extra support to our vulnerable individuals in school.
